

Our Mission: to promote the sport of yachting, the sciences of seamanship and navigation, and to conduct sailing and yachting activities.

For more than 120 years Columbia Yacht Club has stood as an iconic symbol of Chicago's maritime tradition.

"What is that big ship and where does it go?" Are the most frequent questions about the "big blue boat" tied up at the foot of Randolph Street. The ship is home to Columbia Yacht Club and she doesn't go anywhere. This landmark vessel is the *Abegweit* or "*Abby*," the most recent in a series of ships that have been the home to Columbia Yacht Club.

Founded in 1892 and named in honor of the Columbian Exposition, the history of Columbia Yacht Club is a mirror to the history of Chicago. We began just as the city opened her doors to the world 20 years after the great fire. We grew as Chicago grew. We roared in the 20s and struggled through the depression. We built a tradition of skill on the race course. We hosted legendary parties.



We opened our doors to all who desired membership, without prejudice.

Columbia welcomes all who have an interest in our life on the water. Whether you are dedicated to racing, committed to cruising or simply looking for a way to enjoy the glory of Chicago's lakefront, you'll find other members who share your passion.

Columbia has the unique distinction of having always been a floating yacht club. The original Club Ship was a hand-built shack on a floating barge located at the foot of Randolph Street near our current location. Soon "the shack" was replaced by a two-story building, still afloat, to accommodate the new members. The tradition continued, as we moved from our floating club house to our first Club Ship, the *Pere Marquette* (1925-1937), the *Florida* (1937-1982) and the *Abegweit*.

About the Abby

The MV *Abegweit* began service in 1947 as an icebreaking ferry, bringing passengers, autos and railcars from the mainland to Prince Edward Island in Nova Scotia. She was purchased in 1982 to become our new Club Ship, retaining the name, which means "Cradled on the Waves.



A Community of Members

Our unique Club Ship is only part of what makes Columbia exceptional. Sailors and power boaters, racers and cruisers, we are a welcoming home that promotes yachting, racing, Corinthian spirit and service to the community.

We foster a deep sense of pride and camaraderie among our members, officers and staff. Columbia Yacht Club members come from a broad scope of backgrounds, drawn together by their love of the water, desire to share knowledge and a passion for enjoying life.

At Columbia, members find readymade groups of friends who share their common interests. On the water, connect through the Cruising Fleet, Power Fleet, Frostbite Racing, Hard-water (ice) boating, Sunday match racing and other organized events. Aboard the Club Ship, there are parties, activities, events, and fun gatherings all year long. Groups meet to indulge their taste for things like good wine and great books.

We join together to make a difference beyond our Club Ship, as well. Columbia is committed to our community, proudly hosting a series of fund raising events for the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. Led by Columbia members, these efforts have raised more than \$3 million for the fight against blood cancers. As a Club we believe giving back to our community is a key pillar of the Corinthian spirit.

Beginning with that first long-distance race to Michigan City more than a century ago, Columbia established a commitment to the skills and tradition of sailboat racing. Today, the Club hosts some of the most popular Chicago races, including the season kickoff COLORs Regatta, Fran Byrne, Chester Kuttner, Tri-State and, still today, The Michigan City-Chicago race.





How to Join

1. Identify your membership category

Regular Member: Persons applying for Club membership who own any interest in a vessel moored within 35 miles of the Club Ship. Regular Members receive docking privileges, voting privileges and the ability to hold office.

Associate Member: Persons applying for membership who do not own any interest in a vessel moored within 35 miles of the Club Ship. The Associate Membership is very much a social membership with full Club access, but excluding the ability to bring a boat to the dock, vote or hold office.

Junior Member: Persons applying for membership in this Club who have not reached the age of 21. Please request a Junior Member application from the Main Office.

2. Secure three sponsoring members

Membership candidates must be sponsored by three current Club members who are in good standing. If you do not know any Club members, the staff and Membership Committee will be happy to host you at the Club and introduce you to current members.

3. Orientation & approval

After your application has been received, you will be contacted by a representative of the Membership Committee to schedule an orientation. Once completed, your application will be forwarded to the Board of Directors at their next scheduled meeting.
